

THE INTERNATIONAL INTERESTS IN MOBILE EQUIPMENT ACT (AIRCRAFT EQUIPMENT)

The International Interests in Mobile Equipment Act (Aircraft Equipment) , commonly known as the Cape Town Convention, came into force in Manitoba on April 1, 2013, the same day as the proclamation of the enabling Federal legislation.

This International Convention establishes a legal framework for international security interests in mobile equipment and creates an international registry for the protection of those interests.
